Saying Hello:

Hola = Hello. This is the basic way to say hello. Buenos días = Good morning. Buenas tardes = Good afternoon. Buenas noches = Good evening. Buenas = Shorthand way of saying hello, any time of day. It is more casual and works in the morning, afternoon, or evening. You'll hear the locals use this all the time.

Saying Goodbye:

Chao = Bye. The basic way to say goodbye.

Adiós = A slightly more formal way of saying goodbye. We have also heard adiós used as a sort of greeting and goodbye. For example, if you are driving past someone walking on the street and want to greet them, you could say adios instead of hola . The idea is that you aren't staying around to chat. Hasta luego = See you later, or literally, until later. Hasta mañana = See you tomorrow ("until tomorrow").

Manners and Asking for Things: Por Favor = Please. Gracias = Thank you. Perdón = I am sorry. Disculpe = Excuse me (when you need to get someone's attention). Necesito = I need.

Costa Rica is one of the most popular destinations around the world for sportfishing and if you're planning a trip, there is a lot to consider. Here is your go-to guide with everything you need to know about sportfishing in the calm pacific waters of Costa Rica.

Marlin

Optimal Time of Year: Overnight trips June-August - Offshore day trips November-April.

Additional Information: Although June-August for overnight trips and November-April for day trips are the optimal months for marlin, with the right captain and crew you can find black, blue and striped marlin year-round.

Tuna

Optimal Time of Year: Year-Round.

Additional Information: You can find Yellow Fin tuna on the Central Pacific coast of Costa Rica year-round but between June-October is when you will find the 200-pounders.

Sailfish

Optimal Time of Year: December-April. dozens of fish a day.

Dorado

Optimal Time of Year: Year-Round.

Additional Information: June-October you can find smaller 5-10lbs dorado gathering closer in-shore, near the weed and trash-lines. The rest of the year you can find dorado up to 70lbs in the deeper waters, further offshore.

Wahoo



Optimal Time of Year: Year-Round. Additional Information: Can sometimes be caught while fishing for marlin and sailfish usually targeted on reefs closer to shore.

Rooster

Optimal Time of Year: May-December. Additional Information: The bite is good year-round even outside of the optimal months.



Additional Information: There is never a bad time of year to go for sailfish as they always bite above average in Costa Rica. In the best months, boats can easily raise



Mangrove and MonkeyTour

This boat tour takes you through the mangroves for a first-hand experience of this valuable and unique habitat. Hundreds of bird species call the mangroves home, including scarlet macaws, flycatchers, trogons, and more. With a bit of luck, white-faced capuchin monkeys will join you on the boat for an up-close and personal interaction. This is also available as a private tour and will shorten the length of the tour.

Tour length: Two hours plus one hour car ride to the mangroves. What to bring: Camera, binoculars, sunscreen, bug spray. What to wear: Comfortable clothes, hat, strap-on sandals or sneakers.

Manuel Antonio National Park

Manuel Antonio National Park is Costa Rica's most popular, and famous, national park. Its 3 square miles are home to an amazingly diverse collection of plants, birds, and animals. At the entrance, you'll have a chance to see giant bamboo, beach almond trees, sloths, and more. The park's easy trails lead to white sand beaches where you can enjoy a swim in the crystal-clear waters of the Pacific. Fun for the entire family, the monkeys are friendly and will come right up to say hello. Be aware though; they love to steal backpacks! They are, of course, searching for food.

A fun day trip for the entire gang, HRG's concierge can arrange transportation and even bring along a picnic lunch and drinks to set up in a secluded spot, under the almond trees, on the beach.

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Alternatively, after a long morning in the park, if you don't want to do a picnic there are several nice restaurants outside the park.

Manuel Antonio is full of gorgeous jungle-meets-ocean views, lovely little restaurants and bars, art galleries, souvenir shops, canopy tours, and more; a great day trip for everyone, it's a must-do experience during your stay at Los Sueños Resort.

Tour length: All day trip including 1 hour 20 minutes car ride to the National Park.
What to bring: Camera, binoculars, towels, extra clothes, sunscreen, bug spray, swimsuits.
What to wear: Comfortable clothes, hat, sneakers or strap-on sandals.

Ziplining

If you've always wanted to fly, ziplining may be just the ticket. You'll feel like a superhero as you soar over the forest canopy during this high-flying adventure; the descent is 3.5 miles of adrenaline-inducing excitement. Ten cables, including the longest (2,400 ft.) cable in the area, fly you to a total of 12 platforms, where you can get a bird's eye view of the canopy and the forest floor below.

Tour length: Two hours. What to bring: Camera, sunscreen. What to wear: Tennis shoes, comfortable clothes.





Along the way stop at a cantina for an authentic taste of local life. Choose from several tours; we recommend the Side by Side Buggy Experience for families, rather than the 4-wheelers; these work better for older or younger drivers. We can also organize a guide to drive the side by side if necessary.

Tour length: One up to four hours. HRG recommends at least three hours What to bring: Camera, towels, swimsuit, driver's license, a credit card for the security deposit, sunscreen. What to wear: Clothes you don't mind getting wet or dirty, sneakers, sunglasses, hat.



An ATV tour will give you a great sightseeing experience as you rumble through the jungle. It's a great way to visit spectacular waterfalls and see those off-the-beaten-path sights that the area has to offer. As you gain elevation, you can enjoy the panoramic views of Playa Jacó, the Gulf of Nicoya and the Nicoya Peninsula, Tortuga Island, and Manuel Antonio.

Tortuga Island

Take a catamaran from Los Sueños Marina and sail off to the beautiful Tortuga Island, known for its pristine white sandy beaches and tranquil crystal blue waters. It is a perfect spot for swimming, snorkeling, kayaking, beach sports, or simply relaxing on the shore. The tour includes a light breakfast on board, unlimited rum punch and piña coladas, lunch and

The more athletic will probably want to surf more than once so take a lesson, or two at the beginning of your stay.

Tour length: Two hours. What to bring: Towels, dry clothes, a hat, sunglasses, sunscreen. What to wear: Swimsuit.

Aerial Tram

For the best of both tree-top worlds, try a Zipline + Aerial Tram tour. Take the tram up the mountain for a leisurely trip and try to spot monkeys, sloths, and birds that call the canopy home. Once at your destination, zip down the cables from platform to platform for a freewheeling rush of adrenaline.

This unique cable-car tour reveals, firsthand, the secrets of the rainforest while soaring through and over the canopy for a breathtaking ocean view. This is the longest guided aerial tour in Costa Rica, lasting an hour. Also ncluded in the tour is a visit to the butterfly garden, the Medicinal Plants Garden, and a guided visit to terrariums, where you'll turtles, frogs, and other amphibians and reptiles. Fun for the entire family, this is an activity that is not only filled with adventure but also with discovery.

What to bring: Bug spray, camera, sunscreen. What to wear: Sneakers are required, comfortable clothes, hat, sunglasses.

Crocodile Tour

The Crocodile Tour takes you upstream to see crocodiles, birds and other animals in the wild. Located just 20 minutes from Los Sueños Resort! Once you board the boat and head upstream your tour guide will point out the crocodiles along the way. He will actually step off the boat and feed them, it's exhilarating as you are only steps away. As an added bonus, more than 50 bird species, including the iconic scarlet macaw and migrant waterfow.

Carara National Park

Named for the Huetar word for crocodile, this national park is home to several ecosystems, including marshes, lagoons, and gallery forests. Created in 1998, Carara is a favorite destination for bird watchers because of its immense primary rainforest. It's also home to one of the largest populations of scarlet macaws in Costa Rica. Carara lies directly in the transition zone between the dry tropical forest and tropical rainforest. The intersection of the two habitats makes it unique: flora and fauna from both live in one area. The high humidity and primary forests mean the area draws many bird species who feast on the abundant insect population. The park protects the Tárcoles River basin, where during the green season, you can catch sight of the famous Tárcoles crocodiles at one of the stations.

Tour length: Half-day tour.

What to bring: Camera, towels, swimsuits, bug spray, sunscreer What to wear: Sunscreen, sneakers, comfortable clothes, hat.

Tour length: Full-day trip including 1 hour 30 minutes car ride to the river. What to bring: Change of clothes, towels, sunscreen. What to wear: Sneakers, comfortable clothes.

Jungle Tubing

The trip to put-in on the Savegre River takes you through oil palm plantations, teak reforestation projects, a

The gently flowing waters and beautiful scenery of the Savegre River are combined for a relaxing, fun and fascinating experience



Travel deep into the rainforest for a full-day adventure Whitewater Rafing include roller coaster drops as you travel downriver. As you float along, you get a unique view of the rainforest from the water. This trip includes a short hike to some of the most spectacular waterfalls in the area. In the rainy season, you will encounter big-water Class III rapids with roller coaster type waves. In the dry season, you can raft with a guide, or challenge the rapids one-on-one in your own inflatable kayak. Expert

There are 4 different swimming holes to cool off in the fresh mountain

spring water. Or, submerge yourself under the falls for an invigorating water massage. For the more adventurous, there are places to jump into the pools from heights of up to 25 feet!

Tour length: Half-day tour. What to bring: Camera, towels, swimsuits, bug spray, sunscreen What to wear: Sneakers, comfortable clothes, hat, sunglasses.



Actually an ancient sport (Records of earlier forms of SUP have been found as early as 1,000 B.C. and its iterations span over various regions such as Peru, Israel, Italy, China, and beyond), stand up paddleboarding (SUP) is enjoying a resurgence, and there's nowhere better to do it than

Herradura Bay. Just outside Los Sueños Resort, the bay is a perfect place to do (or learn) a little SUP because the waters are calm. The whole family will enjoy exploring the coastline. No previous experience is needed and it's a suitable activity for most fitness levels. Be sure to keep your eyes peeled; you never know what marine life might happen by!



Kayaking

Enjoy spectacular coastal scenery along the way that's just as exciting as the journey's end. Who knows, you may spot a dolphin or humpback whale! When weather conditions permit, enjoy snorkeling from the beach. Other activities may include beachcombing and monkey- or birdwatching. No experience is necessary! This tour is open to experienced kayakers or adventurous first-timers; it's a great way to get out on the water.

Horseback-Riding & Waterfall Tour

This is perhaps one of the best ways to discover the wonders of the Costa Rica rainforest. The adventure park has some of the best-kept horses and views in the area. Come and discover nature at its best on our property, where you will also enjoy our waterfalls and natural swimming pools. There, you will saddle up and depart on your journey to the waterfalls and swimming areas. Upon arrival at the swimming waterfall area, your bilingual guide will offer you fresh fruit and water and you will have some time to relax and enjoy the waterfalls and natural slide.

After 2 "zips" over the river, it's another short hike down-river for swimming and cliff jumping (from heights of 4-25') if you're up for the challenge! After 4 waterfalls, it's a short climb up and out of the canyon and another 15-20 minutes of hiking back to the truck.

Tour length: Half-day tour. What to bring: Camera, towels, swimsuits, bug spray, sunscreen. What to wear: Sneakers, comfortable clothes, hat.

Chocolate Tour

The Chocolate Experience will start with a short 30-minute walk, where we will introduce you to the Central Pacific transitional forest, during the walk, we can observe the amazing flora and fauna, once the walk is over its time to start with the Chocolate Experience, Vista Los Sueños Adventure Park has the first International Cocoa collection of the Central Pacific, during this experience you will learn about the different varieties of Cocoa, as well as the ancestral history and the impact on the world economy and the most important part is that you will be able to try the actual Cocoa fruit before the process, also be part of the Cocoa production process, as well as try different types of Chocolat and mix it with tropical fruits. As an additional plus on this experience, you will learn about 2 of the most traditional agricultural products of Costa Rica "Sugar cane" and "Coffee" you will have direct contact with the plants and the natural history of these crops. At the end of the experience, there

will be organic chocolate bars with different Cocoa percentages as well as other Cocoa products for purchase.

Chocolate Experience Includes: Guided tour with a bilingual guide, tasting of chocolate and fruits. Duration: 2 Hours (approx.). What to bring: comfortable clothes,

sunscreen, tennis shoes, sunglasses, and a camera.

Los Sueños Beach Club

Of course, we'd be remiss if we didn't mention Los Sueños Resort's very own white sand beach, located within-and accessible by-the exclusive multi-million dollar Los Sueños Beach Club. With a massive, free-form swimming pool, swim-up bar, kiddie pool area, Alfresco Restaurant, and playground. This beach pretty much has it all. Protected by Herradura Bay, this beach is perfect for swimming.

Herradura Beach

Right outside the main gates of Los Sueños Resort, turn right toward the ocean. At the end of the road, you'll find a great swimming beach, kayaks for rent, and a few beachside restaurants. This beach tends to be a bit crowded, but it's fun for lunch and sunsets. This is a good beach for swimming as it is protected by the bay.

Playa Jacó

If you prefer a more secluded area, just drive down the outer road beyond the Hermosa village till you find the perfect spot, grab your stuff and pull up a piece of sand! This beach is a surfing beach; do not enter the water without some kind of floatation device.

Playas Esterillos Este & Oeste

These beaches are a bit further down the road at about a half-hour to 40 minutes from Los Sueños Resort. The good news is, they are far less crowded than Herradura, Jacó or Hermosa. The not so great news is that there are far fewer places to eat and drink; though there are a few bars, restaurants and hotels sprinkled along the way. These beaches are best for surfing and sunning.

Playa Manta

· Casado - The national dish is the Casado and consists of a piece of protein, a salad, rice, beans, and fried sweet plantain. The word "casado" actually means to be married, and this is how the term came to be used for food, because once a man was "casado" he would have food for life.

• Gallo Pinto - One of the greatest things about the food here, it's simple but delicious!

Gallo Pinto traditionally is a mixture of beans and rice leftover from the night before, mixed with some peppers, onions, cilantro, Lizano sauce, and other spices. It's one of the few traditional Costa Rican foods that you must try here.

· Soda - Similar to a diner, a "soda" is a small, informal restaurant that serves traditional Costa Rican dishes like Casado and Gallo Pinto for as little as \$3-4 USD a plate. This is where the locals eat!

 Pulperia – A pulperia is a neighborhood convenience store that sells essential supplies, food items like canned goods, eggs, milk, bread, and some produce. Almost every small town has a pulperia, but the prices at these shops are often marked up 10-20% for the convenience.

• Eggs are sold unrefrigerated.

 Coffee - You will find some of the best coffee in the world, here in Costa Rica! The most traditional and one of the best methods of preparation is to brew using a "chorreador", a pour-over that utilizes a filter made out of a special cloth that is hung from a wooden frame.

• Bananas - Second largest exporter of bananas in the world, so make sure to eat some of those delicious local bananas!

• Water - the tap water is safe to drink in Los Sueños Resort. They pride themselves on the state of the art water treatment system in place.

 Chiliguaro – if you are looking to spice up your night, a shot of Chiliguaro will do the trick! Chiliguaro is Costa Rica's most famous cocktail and can be found at almost every bar. Traditionally it is served as a mixture of Guaro, Tabasco sauce, lime juice, and a few other special ingredients.



Biodiversity

· Home to Over 5% of the World's Biodiversity -The country's territory takes up only 0.03% of the world's land, but despite the relatively small area, it is home to more than 5% of the total biodiversity in the world.

 More than 25% of Costa Rica's land is dedicated to national parks, reserves and wildlife refuges. Tourists and locals alike are drawn to Costa Rica's natural beauty-and are committed to preserving it. With 20 national parks, 8 biological reserves, animal refuges, and protected areas, 26 percent of Costa Rica's land is protected.

 Volcanoes - There happens to be well over 121 volcanic formations in the country. One way to cool down is to hike around some of the landscape or to enjoy the hot springs around the volcano. Poás Volcano has the second widest crater in the world, and Arenal Volcano is known as a stratovolcano - a tall, symmetrical volcano that's built upon successive layers of rock, ash, and lava.

· Butterflies, Butterflies and more butterflies -Costa Rica is home to approximately 90% of the butterfly species found in all of Central America and over 18% of all butterfly species in the world. Some of the world's smallest, largest and most magnificent species can be found here and there are a number of butterfly gardens and farms where you can enter enclosed areas and walk among the fluttering beauties.

· Costa Rica is home to wild sloths - Sloths are incredible animals and they are a favorite here in Costa Rica. The Costa Rican forests are home to these tree roaming animals, so when you go, look out for sloths!

• Jesus Christ lizard - The Basilisk, also known as Jesus Christ Lizard can literally walk on water, and that's how it got its nickname. Keep an eye out for these awesome creatures on any jungle hike. It's an amazing sight!

• Orchids - Are you a flower lover? Then you will be happy to hear that you can find more than 1.400 varieties of orchids!

• Turtles - During Costa Rica's arribada ("mass arrival"), as many as 100,000 Olive Ridley turtles come ashore on Ostional National Wildlife Refuge's isolated beaches, leaving behind as many as 10 million eggs. You will have many

opportunities to see the turtles in person at either Jacó or Hermosa beach.

 Hummingbirds - Over 50 Species of Hummingbirds are Found in Costa Rica and a Imost 15% of all hummingbird species can be found in Costa Rica. From the smallest one weighing in at only 2 grams to the largest weighing a whopping 11.5 grams.

• Dogs roam freely. Sometimes they have owners, other times they are community pets. They are almost always friendly and will often adopt you for a walk along the beach.

 The national animal of Costa Rica is the white-tailed deer. The white-tailed deer was declared a national symbol during the administration of José María Figueres, who was a former president of Costa Rica, on May 2, 1995.

 Ecofriendly - Costa Rica has set a goal to become the first fossil-free country in the world, and they are already on a good path to achieve the goal. It's one of the most eco-friendly countries in the world, and today, almost 99% of all energy is renewable.



Random Facts

• Army - Costa Rica is one of the few countries in the world that have no army. They abolished the army in 1948 after the civil war ended.

• There are 7 provinces which make up the country including San José (where the capital is), Cartago (where the capital used to be), Alajuela (located in the central valley), Heredia (beautiful and mountainous), Guanacaste (the Northern region of Costa Rica), Limón (home to beautiful Caribbean beaches) and Puntarenas (home to Los Sueños Resort and extends all through the Central & South Pacific Coasts).

 Street Names - Costa Rica Only Started Using Street Signs in 2012. Unlike the Western world, Costa Rica does not use street names and does not have a postal code system. So, don't be surprised when your hotel address sounds something like this: "200m South of the mango tree then 50m East. It's the house in front of the house with the red gate". Pro Tip: using google maps can be a big help as you're traveling around! • Want to learn the national anthem? The national anthem of Costa Rica is played daily on most radio stations at 7:00 am. Tune in, it's a great way to practice your Spanish!

• Discoteca vs nightclub - In Costa Rica, a Discoteca is a nightclub, and a nightclub is actually a strip club. So, make sure you ask for the right thing on your nights out!

•Life Expectancy - A little-known health fact about Costa Rica's population is that the life expectancy here is almost 79 years, one of the highest in the world. Costa Rica is also home to one of the 5 Blue Zones in the world. Blue Zones are known as areas of the world where people live measurably longer lives.

• Costa Rica is close to the Equator, giving the country a solid 12 hours of daylight year-round. The upside to this is that the sun always rises by 5:45 am and sets by 6:00 pm. Side note: Costa Rica has the most breathtaking sunsets ever!
